The alpha value is always between zero and one: If it equals zero you, add no part of the error and your forecast is always the same number. If it equals to one, you add the entire forecast error and do no smoothing at all. As you might expect, the larger the alpha value, the more of the forecast error is added. It makes the forecast more responsive to actual changes in the demand, but also can equate to more reaction (and disruption) in the organization as it constantly strives to react to a more erratic forecast. Forecast Error

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Mean Forecast Error (MFE). As the name implies, this term is calculated as the mathematical average forecast error over a specified time period. The formula is:

$$MFE = \frac{\sum_{t=1}^{n} (A_t - F_t)}{n}$$

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Mean Absolute Deviation (MAD)

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The formula is again given as the name of the term. It literally means the average of the mathematical absolute deviations of the forecast errors (deviations). The formula is, therefore:

$$MAD = \frac{\sum_{t=1}^{n} \left| A_t - F_t \right|}{n}$$

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Trade-off Approaches

The general objective of developing a good S&OP is to find the "best" alternative to align resources to meet the expected demand under certain operating conditions. Often "best" means an attempt to maximize firm profits, but other conditions can also be established to define "best" in the context of the firm's strategic plan. Examples of other conditions may be:

- > Attempting to meet all expected customer demand
- Attempting to minimize inventory investment
- Attempting to minimize the adverse impact on people, often experienced with volatility in the workforce caused by frequent layoffs

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Research Paper: Smart PP&C Systems in the Industry 4.0 Era

Abstract: In furtherance of emerging research within smart production planning and control (PPC), this paper prescribes a methodology for the design and development of a smart PPC system. A smart PPC system uses emerging technologies such as the internet of things, big-data analytics tools and machine learning running on the cloud or on edge devices to enhance performance of PPC processes.

It achieves this by using a wider range of data sources from the production system, capturing and utilizing the experience of production planners, using analytics and machine learning to harness insights from the data and allowing dynamic and near real-time action to the continuously changing production system.

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Research Paper: Alpha Lanka (Pvt) Ltd.

Abstract: Alpha Lanka (Pvt) Ltd operates in the apparel accessories industry in Sri Lanka, where Ontime delivery (OTD) performance is a vital factor. However, achieving OTD to the expected level, which is from 90% to 95%, has become a challenge due to the complications in the production planning process. Currently, the production planning process is done manually by using Excel spreadsheets which increases the complexity of the planning process. The aim of this study is to recommend an innovative production planning tool that enhances OTD performance while giving accurate promise dates.

This study suggested a model of a production planning tool that was developed using spreadsheets and related process improvements to achieve a proper production planning process. The tool was developed using various functionalities and formulas of spreadsheets to streamline the production planning with estimated lead time and to organize the production planning data effectively.
