### The Securities & Commodities Authority (SCA)

# About SCA

Established by Federal Law No. 4 of 2000

Incorporated as a Public Authority in Abu Dhabi

**Separate Legal Personality** with Financial & Administrative Independence

Reports to The Cabinet of Ministers



#### SCA's Objectives

1. **Provide an opportunity to invest savings and funds** in securities and commodities in a manner that:

- Ensures the interest of the national economy, secures the integrity and accuracy of transactions
- Ensures prices are determined by means of supply and demand
- **Protect investors** by establishing the bases for sound and just dealings between market participants

2. **Develop investment awareness** by conducting research and reporting the findings and recommendations

3. Ensure financial and economic stability

Article 4 of Federal Law No. 4 of 2000



#### Restrictions & Powers Given to SCA

#### Restrictions for SCA

- Enter into commercial activities;
- Have private interests of its own in any undertaking; or
- Own or issue securities.

#### Powers given to SCA

- Propose regulations;
- Create regulations, in consultation & co-ordination with the markets licensed in the State;
- Form specialist technical committees, and specify the scope of their work and their remuneration;
- Maintain contact with international markets to obtain and exchange information and know-how, and join relevant Arab and international organisations and federations;
- Perform all other acts which assist in achieving the Authority's objectives or the exercise of its powers in accordance with the law.



### The Organs of SCA

#### The Organs of SCA



**Chairman** – H.E. the Minister of Economy

Members – a total of **nine members** representing different institutions including

- Chief Executive
- **Five persons** nominated by the Chairman and the chief executive



### SCA – Further Requirements

**Remuneration of Board Members -** determined by the Council of Ministers

**Period in office - four years**, renewable once, with the exception of the Chief Executive of the Authority.

Ownership of securities - upon joining the board, every member must declare securities owned by himself, his spouse and minor children as well as any holdings with any broker to SCA Immediate termination of membership members have to forfeit their membership in the following events:

- Conviction of an offence of dishonour or breach of trust
- Bankruptcy; or
- Failure to attend 3 consecutive meetings without an acceptable excuse



### SCA - Further Requirements

Frequency of Board meetings - At least once every 2 months OR as required by the chairman's invitation.

Validity of Board meetings
 valid if attended by the majority of the members including the chairman (or his deputy)



Resolutions - passed by a majority of the votes of the members present at the meeting. In the event the vote is undecided the chair has the deciding vote

#### Responsibilities of the Board of Directors

#### Responsibilities

**Ensure that the regulations** of Article 4 of Federal Law No. 4 of 2000 and subsequent amendments are applied.

Collect notifications and complaints relating to the activities of the markets or brokers and take appropriate actions.

Ensure markets and brokers submit annual audited financial statements, within one month following the end of the financial year.

Ensure markets have **adequate disclosure rules** in place related to any substantial developments regarding the companies listed on that market.

Ensure **transparency and disclosure** as prescribed in the Law and the resolutions implementing it.

**Issue and maintain resolutions** concerning membership of the markets as well as concerning trading in securities and commodities

**Undertake all other acts** which assist the board in achieving the objectives of SCA.

Report on the markets' activities to the Cabinet of Ministers on a **semi-annual** basis.



#### SCA Financial Affairs

**Annual funds** allotted by the Federal Government

**Listing fees and annual fees** levied on the companies and the brokers in the markets

SCA's Income Sources

Income which accrues under the regulations from the following

Fees levied on trading, and fees for the services rendered by the markets

Fines levied on brokers and companies whose securities are listed for trading, and any other fines



#### The Markets



Each market has to take the form of a local public establishment or a public joint stock company licensed by SCA



Local public establishments have to be administered by the Board of Directors. None of the members of the market's board may be on the board of directors of a public joint-stock company or a financial broker.



Member of the Board of a market must step down in the event of:

- Conviction of offence of dishonour, breach of trust
- Declared bankrupt
- Failure to attend three consecutive meetings without an acceptable excuse

#### The Markets – Continued

#### Ownership of Securities

- The market's chairman, board members, general manager and his deputy **MUST** declare the securities owned by:
  - Himself,
  - His spouse, &
  - Minor children as well as any holdings with any broker

#### Responsibilities of Board of Directors

- Appoint the market's **general manager & his deputy**
- Establish the organisational structure, annexes, internal regulations & administrative rules
- Monitor the trading transactions in securities and commodities on a daily basis
- Present **reports and data to SCA** and issue the necessary press releases



#### The Markets - Continued







#### Market's Sources of Income



- Fees levied on trading and for the services rendered by the market
- Any fines levied on brokers or companies whose securities are listed for trading



### Clearing, Settlement, Transfer of Ownership & Custody

<u>Securities Price Information</u> - prices need to be displayed in accordance with the market's regulations.

<u>Ownership transfer</u> – transfer of ownership of securities, registration and custody agreements have to be **in accordance with the market's regulations**, and without delay.

<u>Suspending of trading</u> - the market's board may temporarily suspend all trading. A majority of board members must be present to suspend trading.

<u>Suspending or reinstating rules or regulations</u> – the market's board may <u>freeze</u>, <u>suspend or bring back into force</u> any rules or regulations. The majority of the board must be present.



#### Clearing, Settlement, Transfer of Ownership & Custody - Continued

**Sanctions –** SCA board has the right to impose sanctions on a market when it fails to pay any due amounts. The sanctions are ranked in the following order:



<u>Warning:</u> a warning can be given to the market explicitly stating which financial requirement has been violated.



Notice to rectify – SCA can serve a notice to the market to rectify the cause of the violation within 30 (thirty) days of the date of the notice.



<u>Penalty</u> – SCA can levy a penalty for delay of payment, a part-month shall be considered a full month.



<u>Suspension</u> – SCA may <u>temporarily suspend</u> a market from operation in the event fees are <u>unpaid</u>. Alternatively, the matter may be brought before the board.

#### Disclosure & Transparency

Any person having a connection with activities in securities may be required to disclose and submit information related to these activities.

The board may order investigations to be conducted in relation to implementation of the law and its subsequent resolutions.

Companies need to disclose any price sensitive information to the market.

Market manipulation and insider trading is **NOT** permitted

### Disclosure & Transparency - Continued

Any employee of a listed company can buy or sell shares in the company, directly or via a broker, under these conditions:

Approval of the transaction by the board of directors; and

Disclosure of the transaction, including quantity, price and other details required to the market.

Any transaction by employees not approved or disclosed are null and void.



### The Functioning of the Securities & Commodities Authority

Organs of SCA & their Competencies

#### Administration

- Chairman of the board is the head of SCA
- He, or his **deputy**, represents SCA to third parties and before the courts
- The chairman or his deputy:
  - **Invites** the board to meet
  - Presides over meetings
  - Issues resolutions
  - Appoint experts, consultants and office-holders of the special and the first grades



#### The Functioning of the Securities & Commodities Authority – Continued

- Delegation:
  - The chairman may delegate any of their competences to their deputy or any board members, or the chief executive
  - Delegation **MUST** be specific and in writing.
- The deputy chairman shall take the place of the chairman in his absence
- The board shall meet upon request by at least four members
- An emergency invitation may be sent by **any means** of communication.
- A meeting of the board is valid if attended by a **majority** of its members, **including the chairman or his deputy**
- Voting by proxy or by letter is NOT permitted
- In cases where the board cannot meet, the chairman may take the requisite decision.
- The board, after the chairman's presentation, may **affirm**, **amend or revoke** the decision.

#### The Functioning of the Securities & Commodities Authority – Continued



#### **Finances**

- SCA's fiscal year is **1 January** until **31 December**.
- The chief executive must submit the draft budget to the board for approval at least one month before the new fiscal year.
- The chief executive must prepare SCA's final accounts, within 90 days following the end of the fiscal year and present to the board with auditor's report.
- The auditor may have sight of SCA's records and financial documents.
- If he is prevented from performing his duties, or is unable to carry them out fully, he shall document this in a report and submit to the board.
- SCA is required to keep regular books of account.

### Market Licensing and Supervision



#### **Conditions**



- It occupies an appropriate building fitted out with the technical equipment.
- It is **electronically linked** with the State's other markets.



### Market Licensing and Supervision - Continued

Submitted applications must be supported by:

The **local resolution** establishing the market

A statement of the names of the members of the market's board of directors including specific information

A statement in the name of the **market's director general and his deputy** including specific information

The **organisational structure of the market** and a statement of its specialist technical and administrative organs

The **internal regulations** of the market

The electronic registration system for trading, deposit, clearing, and settlement operations and the capacity for electronic linking with the other markets

SCA will examine the license application within 15 days from the date of the application

### Market Licensing and Supervision – Continued

#### **Board's Powers**

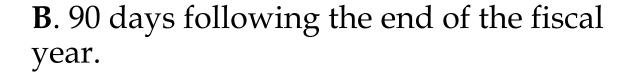
- The board shall take a decision on the application within 30 days from the date the complete application was placed before it.
- The concerned parties will be notified of the board's decision within **one week** from the date it was issued.
- SCA must state its reasons if it rejects an application.
- SCA may conduct **inspections and investigations** necessary to ensure that the legal regulations are being applied.
- SCA may order the party under investigation not to dispose of the securities in their possession.
- Investigation and inspection are confidential.

#### Regulations for Securities and Commodities Markets

The board of directors must have competence to:

Appoint the market's director general and his deputy, and determine their powers

Establish the market's organisational structure, and the internal regulations

Draw up the **necessary proposals** to amend the regulations issued and present them

**Monitor** trading transactions in securities and commodities

**Present** reports and data to SCA and to issue the necessary press releases

**Approve** the annual balance sheet of the market's income and expenditure

Levy penalties on brokers and recommend the removal of them to SCA

Consult with SCA in respect of the fees charged in implementing the law

**Handle applications** for entering of brokers and the listing of securities

Deal with any other matters to ensure the **proper & regular working** of the market



#### Regulations for Securities and Commodities Markets – Continued

### Establishment and Management

- The board of directors may exercise the following powers:
  - Establish specialist **technical organs** for the market to perform its tasks, including an organ for:
    - trading, clearing and settlement
    - the monitoring of prices
    - monitoring and investigation
    - research and studies
    - And financial & administrative organs
  - Work to develop, train and render qualified necessary cadres in line with modern methods
  - Form permanent or interim specialist committees



### Regulations for Securities and Commodities Markets - Continued





Membership is obligatory for the following:

- Licensed brokers
- Joint-stock companies
- Any other entity whose securities are listed in the market
- Note: SCA requires to be notified within one week of a member being entered on the market's register.



#### Regulations for Securities and Commodities Markets - Continued

#### Trading:

- Trading must take place five days a week, at least two hours a day
- The market must provide an electronic trading system which ensures:
  - Automatic stoppage of orders which exceed the limits of the broker's guarantee.
  - Enabling all companies and entities to view the register of their own shares.
- A **special order** is any order approved in advance by the market in excess of 80% of the broker's bank guarantee.
- The market is required to allocate a **single number** to each investor
- A trading account may be opened in the names of two or more investors.
- Clearing and settlement operations must be carried out based on **delivery against payment** of the price.
- A trading transaction should be settled within **two working days** of the trade date.



#### The Corporate Governance Guide for Joint Stock Companies

#### |Corporate Governance

• Corporate Governance is the set of **regulations**, **criteria and procedures** that ensure discipline in managing companies.

#### The Pillars of the Guide

- <u>Accountability</u> towards all <u>shareholders</u> and <u>stakeholders</u>, directing the board to develop strategy, supervise, guide and control the way the company operates.
- <u>Equity</u> ensuring <u>fair treatment for all shareholders</u>, including minority shareholders, and protecting their rights.
- <u>Transparency and disclosure</u> the company must ensure that accurate and timely disclosures are made of all material matters.
- <u>Responsibility</u> the company <u>must recognise the rights of</u> other stakeholders and encourage cooperation between the company and stakeholders.





### The Corporate Governance Guide for Joint Stock Companies

The pillars of the
guide aims to
achieve:

Develop a framework to address and protect rights of all stakeholders.

Determine the **responsibilities** of the board and the executives.

Strengthen the role of the **board** and its **committees** and develop their capabilities.

Ensure transparency, neutrality and equity in the capital market.

Provide effective, **balanced processes & procedures** for dealing with conflicts of interests.

Strengthen mechanisms of accountability and control.

Ensure the application of effective mechanisms for **risk management**, **internal controls and procedures** of the company.

Support the **efficiency** of the audit of the company and its instruments.

Raise awareness in relation to the concept of **professional behaviour**.

Ensure regular, effective and fair communication with shareholders.



### The Corporate Governance Guide for Joint Stock Companies

#### Responsibilities for Implementation

- The **board of directors** takes responsibility for the implementation of the guide
- The company must maintain all documents that evidence the way it is governed
- The documents must be held at the company headquarters for at least 10 years



### Gifts, Conflicts & Related Party Transactions

In order to prevent conflicts of interest between a board member and the company, the following must be avoided:

#### Gifts

 Gifts offered to influence board members to perform certain tasks on behalf of the company

#### Insiders Register

 The company's board is expected to have written rules addressed to any board members or employees that have securities issued from the company



#### Insiders Register

- The board can also assign a special committee it deems suitable to:
  - Prepare a special and complete register for all **insiders**, including **prior and subsequent disclosures of insiders**.
  - Manage, follow up and supervise the transactions of the insiders.
  - Notify SCA and the market of an updated list of insiders at the **beginning of each fiscal year**.
  - Submit a copy of the **Insiders Register** to SCA on request.
  - Comply with any other requirements specified by SCA.



#### Transactions with Related Parties

- A related party is:
  - Chairman and other members of the board
  - Members of the senior executive management
  - Employees
  - Shareholder who owns 30% or more stake in the company
  - Subsidiaries, sister / affiliate companies

For **transactions < 5%** of the company's capital – board consent

For **transactions** >= 5% threshold - approval of the general assembly

**Transactions > 5%** of the issued capital, SCA accredited assessor

Transactions involving related parties – related party is **NOT** allowed to vote

Normal business transactions are **NOT** considered transactions with related parties.



A shareholder of 5% stake or more is entitled to:

Review the company records and any documents relating to those transactions

File a lawsuit before the competent court regarding the transactions concluded with related parties

If the transaction is unfair or involves a **conflict of interest** and causes harm to the rest of the shareholders, the court may cancel the transaction

**Credit Rating Agencies**

Dealing in Securities

The paid-up capital is a minimum of AED 30 million.

#### Main functions:

- 1. Category Manager or Official
- 2. Compliance Officer
- 3. Risk Management Officer

#### **Approved Jobs & their Financial Activities:**

Trading Manager, Operations Manager, and Broker Representative →

- 1. Trading and clearing broker
- 2. Trading broker in global markets
- 3. Broker for trading non-exchange traded derivative contracts and currencies in the spot market

Broker Representative ONLY → Trading broker

Trading Manager ONLY → Securities dealer

Dealing in Investments

The paid-up capital is a minimum of AED 50 million.

#### Main functions:

- 1. Category Manager or Official
- 2. Compliance Officer
- 3. Risk Management Officer
- 4. Investment Operations Manager

#### **Approved Jobs & their Financial Activities:**

Fund Investment Manager or Portfolio Manager, Principal Financial Analyst, and Financial Analyst →

- 1. Managing investment funds' investments
- 2. Managing securities portfolio
- \*Administrative services for investment funds is a financial activity that is Not Applicable to an Approved Job.

Custody, Clearing and Recording

The paid-up capital is a **minimum** of AED 50 million.

#### Main functions:

- 1. Category Manager or Official
- 2. Compliance Officer
- 3. Risk Management Officer
- 4. Operations Manager

### <u>Financial Activities Under Custody, Clearing and Recording:</u>

- 1. Safe custody
- 2. General clearing
- 3. Covered warrant issuer
- 4. Depository bank for depository receipts
- 5. Depository bank agent for depository receipts
- 6. Registrar of private joint stock companies

Credit Rating Agencies

The paid-up capital is a **minimum** of AED 5 million.

#### Main functions:

- 1. Category Manager or Official
- 2. Compliance Officer
- 3. Credit Rating Analyst
- 4. Credit Rating Analysis Official

#### Requirements for a body licensed to work in a financial free zone:

- Provisions of the Companies Law related to the conduct of business by free-zone companies within the State.
- Carries out the activity through its headquarters in the financial free zone or within the state.
- Submits **proofs of agreement** with the regulatory authority.



Ranking and Advice

No capital requirement.

Main functions:

- Category Manager or Official
   Compliance Officer
- 3. Risk Management Officer

#### **Approved Jobs & their Financial Activities**

Financial Analyst →

- Financial Consulting
- Financial Consultant (Line Manager)
- Listing Consultant

Promotion Manager →

1. Promotion

## Accounting System Controls

Firms that are licensed for the 'Dealing in Securities' category are also mandated to provide an electronic accounting system to manage accounts. This is also known as a 'Unified Centralised Back Office System' which must meet certain technical standards.
